Early spring brought us Campfires & Cocktails, a fundraiser hosted by the Lovatt family that benefits the Neil Lovatt Memorial Fund. We are thankful for everyone who helped make this night a great success, raising:

Once again, May delivered sunny skies at our annual Golf Tournament at Wyndance Golf Club. Always a favourite among our loyal friends, we hit the links for deserving youth and raised:

Just a few weeks later, our full-time staff and summer leadership team joined together for our annual Run Round Rosseau event, an initiative that sends local, disadvantaged youth in the Muskoka region to summer camp, raising over:

We joined the Masson family for another wonderful October evening at the Mackenzie's Hope Gala. The Atlantis Pavilion was transformed into a Muskoka-like setting and fun was had by all. This program continues to impact many young lives affected by cancer. The Gala raised:

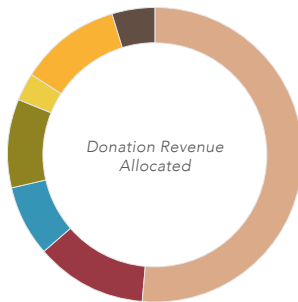
